Do you offer online tutoring?

How much improvement do you see in your students?

What are the differences between Foundational and Advanced Levels?

The Advanced Level is taught by certified teachers with 10+ years of experience with teaching high performing students. This is best suited for students working to earn a score of 29+ with a GPA of 3.5+. These tutors know the intricacies of the ACT and can put students on a path to success by quickly finding the root of the problem that is stunting growth.

The Foundational Level is designed for students that need a longer runway to reach their goals. When a student's score is below a 21, we recommend this level so that students can strategically walk through a more detailed process to gain skills that will make the student not only successful on the ACT but also in future courses. In the Foundational Level, students may also request homework help for math or English. This level is also appropriate for motivated middle school students that want to build skills for future ACT success. Foundational Level tutors are in the top 1% of ACT test-takers or certified teachers with a passion for teaching the fundamentals of a subject.

The work of the Advanced Level program can be accomplished in an intense 6 to 12 weeks while the work of the Foundational Level may require a consistent 9 to 18 weeks. It's recommended that you schedule the Foundational Level sessions in conjunction with the school calendar on a 9-week basis. For example, you may schedule once a week from the beginning of the school year until Fall Break and then a second round from Fall Break until Winter Break.

For both levels, you can book as you go. There are no minimum sessions required, but families that see the most results commit to a 6 to 18 week process. Students are free to move around from tutor to tutor according to needs as you monitor progress. CAP is here to support you until you feel confident and thoroughly prepared.
